At long-awaited, the Bonn Opera House will once again be welcoming audiences on August 28 - and then immediately with a red-carpet event graced by so many celebrities: star violinist **David Garrett** will lead the lineup of international guests at the European Cultural Awards ceremony. He will be joined by top model **Barbara Meier**, figure skating heroine **Katarina Witt**, climate activist **Nico Rosberg**, star trumpeter **Till Brönner**, the **Scorpions**, singer **Heinz Rudolf Kunze** and **Tobias Moretti**.

Under the patronage of North Rhine-Westphalian Prime Minister **Armin Laschet**, the gala will be dedicated to Ludwig van Beethoven, whose anniversary BTHVN2020 will be celebrated on the occasion of his 250th birthday until September 2021. For this purpose, numerous top-class artists will come together on the grand opera stage, led by the **Beethoven Orchestra Bonn**, which has just been named a UN Climate Ambassador, under the direction of its General Music Director **Dirk Kaftan**. Presenter and soprano **Annette Dasch** and cultural journalist Axel Brügge-mann will guide through the evening. Songwriter **Katie Melua**, the Scorpions and Till Brönner will each perform together with the orchestra with their own newly arranged pieces. "For us it is a great honor to be nominated for the European Culture Award and to perform live in front of our audience again after such a long time. The developments of the past years have clearly shown us that we all have to take care of our earth together. The European Cultural Award is a wonderful signal to us artists not only to live the European idea, but also to network worldwide in order to actively shape the great challenges of the future. As a UN ambassador, the Beethoven Orchestra Bonn feels particularly motivated and committed to this," says Dirk Kaftan.

The presentation of the European Cultural Awards has been considered a cultural highlight in the national event calendars for many years. Canceled in 2020 due to a pandemic, the Cultural Awards Gala will finally take place again this year. "After last year's cancellation, we are extremely pleased that our gala, which is safe thanks to an intrinsically 3G hygiene concept, can even take place as the first cultural event in front of an audience at the Bonn Opera House. The event is almost sold out due to the reduced audience capacity. We are therefore delighted that the award ceremony will be broadcast live and exclusively to a large audience on August 28, 2021 on MagentaMusik 360 or on the #dabeiTV channel on MagentaTV free of charge," says Annett Reeder, Managing Director of the European Cultural Forum.

For many years, the European Cultural Awards have been one of the most highly regarded cultural highlights. Every year, the gala is held in major European cultural venues such as the Frauenkirche in Dresden, the Elbphilharmonie in Hamburg, and the Vienna State Opera. The European Culture Award honors personalities, initiatives, artists, politicians and institutions for outstanding services and achievements for Europe and its people.
